CHURCH PICNIC

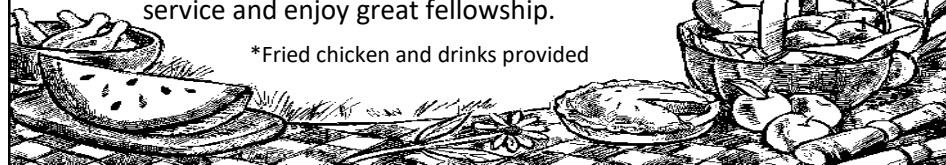
When: Sunday, May 26 at 4:30 p.m.
